



Nathan Favero
Nathan Favero is a Provost Associate Professor in the School of Public Affairs at American University. He received a PhD in political science from Texas A&M University in 2016. His research focuses on internal management, performance, research and teaching. He has published in the Journal of Public Administration, and has presented at numerous conferences. Much of his empirical work has concentrated on issues topics in the context of education, drawing data from public school systems in Texas, New York City, California, South Korea, and Denmark.

Sharon Glad
Sharon Glad is Associate Professor at the Friedman School of Public Policy and Government and the Public Science Department at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. Before taking her current position, in October 2010, she completed a PhD (2007) in Political Science at the University of Oxford and Nuffield College and held a faculty position at King's College London School of Management as well as a research fellowship at a faculty position at the University of York and Regulation at the London School of Economics. Her research is predominantly within the field of public administration, employing a mixture of quantitative and qualitative methods. The foci of her research include bureaucratic agencies' identity, reputation and responsiveness to public demands, civil servants' individual-level identities and inter-governmental social networks, discrimination of minorities and citizen strategies in citizen-state interactions. Sharon's research contributions, also done in collaboration with colleagues and research students, have been published in the prominent journals in her field, including the Journal of Public Administration Research & Theory, Public Administration Review, Governance, Regulation & Governance and Public Administration.

George Krause
George A. Krause is the Alumni Foundation Distinguished Professor of Public Administration (PhD, West Virginia University, 1994). His previous faculty appointments include serving both as an Assistant and Associate Professor of Political Science at the University of South Carolina (1994-2005) and, more recently, Professor of Political Science at the University of Pittsburgh (2005-2017). Professor Krause's core scholarly interests center on issues pertaining to governance, accountability, and representation in the United States. These interests span a diverse and eclectic set of fields and subfields, including Public Administration & Bureaucracy, Organizational Theory, Executive Politics, Political Economics, Legislative Politics, and Subnational Politics & Policymaking. His current research activities investigate both the selection and the role of bureaucratic leadership in U.S. federal government agencies; the exercise of executive authority; administrative performance; the implications of shared power arrangements for democratic governance and policymaking within the administrative state; and the institutional and organizational aspects of fiscal policymaking in the realm of democratic politics.

Amanda Rutherford
Amanda Rutherford is an associate professor and chair of the Governance and Management faculty in the O'Neill School of Public and Environmental Affairs at Indiana University-Bloomington. Her implications for public delivery, network governance, and accountability, personnel management, and issues of race, equity, and representation in bureaucratic institutions. She is the author or editor of three books and has published in Public Administration Review, the American Political Science Review, Educational Researcher, and the State Journal, among others. She has served on committees and in leadership positions for the Public Management Research Association, the American Political Science Association, the Midwest Political Science Association, the Academy of Management, the Association of Public Policy Analysis and Management, and the Southern Political Science Association.

Lars Tummers
Lars Tummers is Professor of Public Administration and Organization Science at Utrecht University. He was appointed in 2018, at the age of 36. He is an internationally recognized expert on public management, leadership and behavior change. Previously, he worked at IWC and Erasmus University Rotterdam. He also was a Visiting Scholar at the University of Oxford and the University of California, Berkeley. His goal is to understand how people can change behavior to improve lives of themselves and others. Related to this, Tummers is one of the initiators of an interdisciplinary field combining psychology and public administration, called Behavioral Public Administration. He and his colleagues kicked off this field by organizing a KNAW Colloquium on this, where 50 top scholars from various fields united. He subsequently developed core overview articles in the most highly regarded journals in the field. He won various prizes, such as the university-wide Erasmus Prize at Erasmus University, best article awards and the award for outstanding PhD thesis in humanities and social sciences (Praemium Erasmianum Foundation, based on cum laude PhD). He has received various grants, from among others the European Union (FP7, Marie Curie grant carried out at Berkeley, USA) and NWO (VENI, VIDI). Next to his scholarly work, he works regularly with practice, among else with various Ministries, organizations in healthcare and education and consultancy firms.
